



XX Anniversary Open Polish Championship in Western Shooting „Wild Borderland 2026”

COMPETITION REGULATIONS

1. Purpose of the competition:

- selecting the Champions of Poland
- popularization of western Shooting
- integration of the shooting community
- presentation of weapons from the "Wild West" period
- sports competition

2. Organizers of the competition

- Polish Western Shooting Association, Śniatowa 28D, 95-45 Parzęczew
- Polish Sports Shooting Association

3. Date and place of the competition

- 29.04-03.05.2026r. Shooting Range „Shooting-Academy”, ul. Świętego Rocha, 95-045 Parzęczew (GPS:51.93614969445734, 19.204283021339457)

4. Competition program

- Main match: 12 stages Cowboy Action Shooting (SASS®)
- Main match: Wild Bunch – 8 stages (Traditional & Modern)
- Main Match: Untouchables – 6 stages (Regulation Annex no. 1)
- additional competitions:
 - Plainsman – 2 stages (Regulation Annex no. 2)
 - Mountain Man - 2 stages (Regulation Annex no. 5)
 - Speed Gun CAS & WB ONLY: speed pistol, rifle, shotgun (individual)
 - Duell (individual) & Pair Duell (tied together with a rope with another competitor)
Each competitor may only participate once – in one pair.
 - Fast Draw US Original – organizer`s ammunition (.45lc)
 - Derringer – organizer`s weapons and ammunition
 - Pocket Pistol – (Regulation Annex no. 6)
 - Annie Oakley – organizer's weapons and ammunition (competition only for women)
 - Top Gun – setting Polish records (Regulation Annex no. 3)
- Costumes contest (application required during registration)

5. Participation

- All with a valid licensed and appropriate firearms in accordance with applicable regulations
- categories according to SASS regulations
- Prematch for judges is held on a given day of competition one hour before the start of the first circuit. Judges who, for various reasons, could not participate in the prematch take part in the competition on the rights of other competitors.
- Competitors may only participate in the events for which they registered online. Competitors who have not registered will not be allowed to participate in the event.

6. Scoring

- Individual and team, in accordance with the applicable SASS and PZSS regulations

7. Awards

- Individual - medals and diplomas for the first three places
- Medals are awarded for places actually taken, regardless of the competitor's country of origin
- Additional competitions - diplomas for the first three places
- Team - diplomas
- Costumes contest - individually for her and for him and for a couple. The organizer may decide not to award diplomas and prizes.
- In-kind prizes and statuettes in the event of acquiring sponsors
- Best Male, Best Female Competitor (regulations Annex 4) – cup or equivalent prize

8. Application

- Applications after this date will not be accepted and the competitor will not be able to participate in the competition.
- Confirmation of registration is made by paying the entry fee.
- The entry fee must be paid in full by March 31, 2026 to the PSSW Alior Bank account
PL59 2490 0005 0000 4530 1068 4443.
- Competitors may only participate in those competitions for which they have paid the entry fee by March 31, 2026.
- It is not possible to register for a competition and pay the fee during the competition.
- Competitors are required to inform the organizer if they withdraw from the competition.
- Withdrawal by March 31, 2026 entitles the competitor to a 100% refund of the entry fee paid.
- Withdrawal by April 15, 2026 results in a 50% deduction from the entry fee paid to cover organizational costs.
- PSSW members may enter the competition only if the membership fees are paid. Otherwise, the application will not be approved.
- In case of non-payment of the advance the competitor is not allowed to participate in the competition.
- **Exceptions possible in individual cases with the consent of the organizer at the request of the competitor.**

9. Participation costs

9.1. Starting:

- 12 Stages CAS (all SASS® categories) for PSSW members – 270 PLN, other players – 300 PLN
- 8 Stages Wild Bunch for PSSW members – 150 PLN, other players – 170 PLN
- 6 stages Nietykalni for PSSW members – 130 PLN, other players – 150 PLN
- 2 stages Plainsman – 50 PLN
- 2 stages Mountain Man – 50 zł
- Speed gun: each type of weapon and each attempt – 20 PLN (a maximum of 2 attempts for each weapon)
- Duell individual – 40 PLN
- Pair Duell – 40 PLN
- Annie Oakley Cup – 40 PLN
- Derringer – 40 zł
- Top Gun free of charge (only 2 attempts possible)
- Fast Draw US Original – 50 PLN
- Pocket Pistol – 30 PLN
- Costume contest free of charge
- Persons under 17 years of age pay an entry fee of 50% of the indicated amounts.
- The second and each subsequent person under 17 years of age from the same family (in the case of parents shooting at the competition) pay an entry fee of 25%.
- **The entry fee for participation in the competition is each time paid in full (regardless of the number of days).**
- The organizer does NOT provide meals as part of the entry fee. It is possible to order lunch for an additional fee using a separate registration form. Lunch for accompanying persons – cost PLN 30/person, can only be ordered during registration.
- The organizer provides drinks (water, coffee, tea) for competitors as part of the starting fee.
- Cost of participation in the campfire (sausages, bread, drinks and surprise) - PLN 60

9.2. Accommodation:

Possible accommodation in the competition area (upon prior notification):

- Own tent, own caravan / camper - PLN 20 / day for person (connection to electricity included)
- Accommodation at the local hotel base on your own

10. Any other business

- The competition will be conducted in accordance with the shooting range regulations and the PZSS and SASS safety rules.

- The competition is included in the PZSS calendar and will be held in the presence of the technical delegate.
- Participants' own gun and ammunition in accordance with SASS regulations, except for Fast Draw (organizer's ammunition), Annie Oakley Cup (organizer's ammunition & gun), Derringer (organizer's ammunition & gun).
- The Fast Draw competition requires a .45LC caliber revolver that complies with SASS® regulations.
- Pair Duell competition - each competitor may only participate once - in one pair.
- Annie Oakley competition - three shots in 2 minutes.
- The Senior Wild Bunch category is exclusively for competitors aged 65 and over (regardless of the information provided in the form).
- In the Speed Gun competition, competitors may choose only one type of powder to compete with (nitro or BP).
- Speed shotgun: 6 shots at 6 poppers.
- Speed revolver: 10 shots at 3 targets.
- Speed pistol: 14 shots at 4 targets (two magazines).
- Derringer competition: two shots at one target.
- The Mountain Man, Plainsman, Fast Draw, Pocket Pistol, Derringer competition and Frontiersman CAS category will be held without gender division, despite the option in the form, unless the organizer decides otherwise after registration closes.
- The **minimum** amount of necessary ammunition for the main competition:
 - CAS: rifle 120, revolvers 120, shotgun 65
 - WB: rifle 80, pistol 120, shotgun 40
 - Untouchables: SMG 120, pistol 90, shotgun 30
- The organizer does not provide the loan or deposit of weapons.
- Mandatory use of shooting goggles and hearing protection is recommended.
- Clothing in accordance with SASS and PZSS regulations referring to the era is required.
- Uniform for the Untouchables competition in Appendix 1
- The number of SASS categories may change depending on the number of competitors entered.
- If the competitor decides to change the category, he is obliged to inform the organizer about this fact until the end of the track.
- Persons under the age of 18 may participate in the competition only in the presence of a legal guardian.
- Oral or written protests may be submitted to the Clerk of the Course within a maximum of 10 minutes from the end of a given course and will be considered definitively until the next one starts. One-off fee for lodging a protest: PLN 100.
- The organizer has the right to refuse to participate in the competition, as well as to observe the competition as a spectator, to a person whose behavior raises (or raised in the past) doubts as to the observance of the rules of social coexistence, harms or harms the image of the PSSW, whose presence could violate the sense of security of other players.
- Minors may only participate in competitions in the presence of a legal guardian.
- The organizer reserves the right to change the regulations (until the competition starts) and to interpret them later.

Annex 1 to the regulations of the competitions organized by Polish Western Shooting Association

Untouchables competition requirements::

The 10 foot rule applies - from this distance you should not notice any equipment shortcomings.

1. Weapons

Ball - Each model until 1945, for integrated pistol or revolver ammunition.

Rifle: The basic one is the SMG Thompson. PM Sten and clones, PPSz, PPS and Mauser C96, P 08 Parabellum and ViS wz.35 pistols are allowed, provided that the stock-holster can be connected.

Pistol: Basic is the Colt 1911 A1 pistol and clones. All other center fire pistols are allowed, except for modern sports modifications. It is also possible to use weapons listed in the rifle category after disconnecting the stock-holster (it is then necessary to have additional magazines), SA and DA revolvers with reservations as in the pistol.

Shotgun: Basic is Winchester mod. 97 and 12 caliber 12. Any horizontal, pump action or semi auto (Browning 1900, Winchester 1911, Remington 1914) is also allowed, subject to the above restrictions.

2. Ammunition:

Any of the weapons that can be used in accordance with the regulations, with the exception of Magnum and Super Magnum ammunition. FMJ and HP bullets are allowed for paper purposes, and also WC for revolvers. For metal purposes, only projectiles complying with the SASS regulations. The energy and velocity of the bullet shells must comply with the WB regulations. For all other issues of weapons and ammunition, controls and penalties, the SASS and WB rules and regulations apply.

3. Dress code:

The outfit must refer mainly to the interwar period and contain at least 5 elements characteristic of the chosen style (including details such as a signet ring, cufflinks, a pendant or a cigar). It must absolutely match the weapon used. Any objections to the dress code result from the SASS and WB regulations. The use of armpit holsters is allowed - the 170 degree rule still applies.

3. Categories:

A. traditional (Colt 1911, Thompson)

B. Gangster Wood Stock (buttstock pistol)

C. open (other weapons permitted by the regulations)

In each of the above, individual (women and men) and team classification is possible.

Any disputes relating to weapons, ammunition and clothing will be settled by MD immediately and are not subject to more protests.

Annex 2 to the regulations of the competitions organized by Polish Western Shooting Association

Plainsman competition rules

Plainsman is a category of dynamic cowboy shooting in which one to three types of weapons are used. Original weapons, manufactured before 1900 or their replicas:

1. A single-shot rifle with an external hammer, firing traditional revolver or rifle ammunition, with a minimum caliber of .30. Center fire rifles as well as recoil percussion rifles are allowed.
2. Two percussion-firing revolvers of caliber .36 or greater. Revolvers can be six-shot or with more chambers, but only loaded with 5 bullets and 5 percussion caps.
3. Horizontal shotgun with or without external cocks, single shotgun or lever action shotgun in caliber 12g or 16ga.

Black powder only ammunition, pure lead bullets. In the case of using revolver ammunition in a rifle, it is necessary to use the full weight of black powder.

Categories

In the case of a larger number of participants, it is possible to divide into the following categories:

Plainsman Modern - it is allowed to use any rifle approved for the category (also construction with a spring ejector, Harrington & Richardson type), Ruger Old Army revolvers and percussion replicas of other period revolvers. Percussion revolvers may be fired in any style (two hands are allowed). However, violation of the safety rule consisting in the prohibition of covering the drum with the hand results in disqualification from the competition (MDQ).

Any type of shotgun approved in the category may be used.

Plainsman Traditional - in this category we use only traditional Sharps, Rolling Block and High Wall rifle constructions without spring ejectors. The only exception allowed is the Springfield Trapdoor, traditional percussion revolvers, and the single-shot shotguns or horizontal shotguns with external cocks. Revolvers are fired in the Duelist or Double Duelist style.

Rifle targets, depending on the scenario, can be located at distances further than in traditional Cowboy Action Shooting competitions, i.e. 15 - 100m.

Usually, 4-6 shots from a rifle and shotguns are fired on the track, and 2 x 5 shots from revolvers.

The number of shots may be modified depending on the scenario planned on the track. All other matters are governed by the rules of the Single Action Shooting Society.

Annex 3 to the regulations of the competitions organized by Polish Western Shooting Association

Regulations for establishing the Polish record „Top Gun” w CAS

Guns – defined by SASS regulations: rifle, two revolver SA (for Wild Bunch pistol 1911 .45 ACP), shotgun

Ammunition - defined by SASS regulations: 10 – rifle, 10 – revolvers (pistol), 4 – shotgun

Targets - defined by SASS regulations : 10 knockdown targets, 4 poppers

Distance - defined by SASS regulations: odpowiednia dla każdego rodzaju broni.

Costume – defined by SASS regulations for categories

Categories – defined by SASS regulations

Scenario – Hands raised above shooters head, loaded revolvers holstered („Wild Bunch”: loaded pistols holstered, second magazine is on the belt), the loaded rifle and unloaded shotgun are on a table in front of the shooter. After the BEEP shooter engage the closer 5 targets with the first revolver, and next with the second revolver the same targets (Wild Bunch: changing pistol's magazine). Revolvers (pistol) to holsters. With the rifle engage the 5 next targets will stand more distant in „double tap”. Rifle put on the table. With the shotgun, engage the poppers. The end.

Only an attempt with no misses and no procedural will be counted.

The Shooter has only two attempt.

Annex 4 to the regulations of the competitions organized by Polish Western Shooting Association

Regulations for the selection of the Best Male and Best Female Competitor of the Polish Championships

The Best Male and Female Competitor of the competition will be selected from the competitors who completed each of the three competitions: Cowboy Action Shooting, Wild Bunch, Untouchables, by adding up the scores obtained in these competitions.

Annex 5 to the regulations of the competitions organized by Polish Western Shooting Association

Mountain Man competition rules

The competition requires the use of three weapons and only black powder, and in the case of bullet weapons - lead bullets:

1. Any SASS-approved shotgun or muzzle-loading shotgun - 2 shots
2. Revolver carbine or cap-and-ball revolver with stock - 5 shots
3. Cap-and-ball revolver - 5 shots

Annex 6 to the regulations of the competitions organized by Polish Western Shooting Association

Pocket Pistol competition rules

Gun: pocket pistols in 6.35 (.25 ACP) caliber manufactured before 1945 and clones. 2 magazines.

Side-by-side shotgun (coachgun) - shortened barrels (cylinder), without ejectors.

Ammunition: FMJ for the pistol, shotgun shells as for CAS

Procedure:

The shooter sits at a table holding cards in his hands, the rest of the deck in front of him. Next to him on the table is a loaded pistol, a loaded second magazine, and shotgun shells. An unloaded shotgun is on the table. After the signal, he shoots 4 shots at two paper targets with the pistol. He stands up and shoots two or, depending on the scenario, four poppers with the shotgun. If any item falls off the table or safety rules are broken, the start is failed.

Result:

Time increased by each miss or mistake in the scenario (according to SASS rules) and decreased by the number of hits on the target with the pistol. The competitor has two attempts. The better result counts.
